ATTRACTIONS

Abbotsbury Subtropical Gardens - dogs welcome on a lead in garden and outside seating area of restaurant.

Athelhampton House and Gardens - dogs welcome on a lead in the gardens only.

Burrow Farm Gardens - dogs welcome on a lead.

Corfe Castle - dogs welcome on a lead.

Donkey Sanctuary, dogs welcome on a lead.

Forde Abbey, dogs welcome on a lead, gardens and tearoom only.

Hardy's Birthplace, dogs welcome on a lead in the garden.

Kingston Lacy House and Gardens, dogs welcome on a lead, parkland and woodland walks only.

Lulworth Castle and Park, dogs welcome on a lead in the grounds.

Maiden Castle, dogs welcome on a lead.

Max Gate, dogs welcome on a lead outside only.

Minterne Gardens, dogs welcome on a lead.

Montacute House, dogs welcome on a lead in park only.

Nothe Fort, dogs welcome on a lead.

Radipole Lake Nature Reserve, dogs welcome on a lead.

Seaton Tramway, £1 each way and must ride on the lower deck.

Sherborne Castle, dogs welcome on a lead in the gardens only.

Swanage Railway, £1 each way.

Tyneham Village, dogs welcome on a lead.

- **Dogs must be on a lead at all times in cemeteries and church yards/graveyards, allotments in the ownership of parish or town councils and within 5m of the marked perimeter of sports pitch playing surfaces and athletic tracks. Plus formal gardens and orchards.**
- **Note: In addition most attractions in the area will allow 'Assistance Dogs.'**

GUIDELINES FOR DOGS ON BEACHES

Abbotsbury Beach Dogs allowed.

Burton Bradstock 1st June until end of September, restrictions apply but dogs are welcome on at least part of the beach all year round. See signage at beach.

Charmouth East Beach No dogs in July or August between 10am and 6pm.

Charmouth West Beach Dogs allowed on beach but must be on lead from 1st of May and the 30th of September.

Cogden Dogs allowed.

Chesil Beach Dogs allowed.

Eype Dogs allowed.

Lyme Regis Monmouth - dogs allowed. Front beach - no dogs between 1st of April and 31st of October. East beach - dogs allowed.

On all land surrounding the sea inc car parks dogs must be on a lead.

Seatown No dogs allowed at any time.

West Bay No dogs allowed between 1st of May to the 1st of October. Dogs allowed under East Cliff. On all land areas of West Bay dogs must be on a lead.

Weymouth No dogs allowed between 1st of May to the 1st of October.
